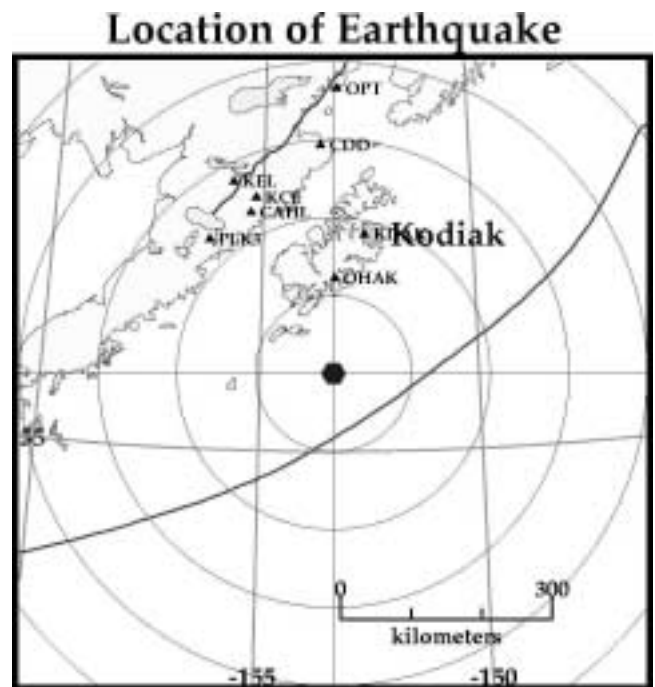
The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a minor earthquake that occurred on Thursday, June 5th at 1:17 AM AKDT south of Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 3.7 and was located at a depth of about 12 miles (20 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. No reports of this event being felt or causing damage have been received at this time.

Distance to nearby locations:

117 km (73 miles) SSE of Akhiok
134 km (84 miles) S of Old Harbor
176 km (110 miles) SSE of Larsen Bay
188 km (117 miles) SSE of Karluk
206 km (129 miles) SSW of Kodiak
209 km (131 miles) S of Port Lions
219 km (137 miles) SSW of Ouzinkie
312 km (195 miles) ESE of Pilot Point

Depth: 20 km
Magnitude: ML 3.7



Circles are 111 km (70 miles) apart.

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.
