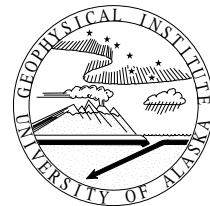

ALASKA EARTHQUAKE INFORMATION CENTER

July 23, 2008
8:57 am

The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a minor earthquake that occurred on Tuesday, July 22nd at 9:06 PM AKDT in southeastern Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 3.0 and was located at a depth of about 0 miles (1 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. This event was felt in Juneau. No reports of this damage have been received at this time.

Distance to nearby locations:

54 km (34 miles) E of Douglas
56 km (35 miles) E of Juneau
111 km (70 miles) NE of Angoon
118 km (74 miles) ENE of Hoonah
119 km (74 miles) ENE of Tenakee Springs
133 km (83 miles) E of Gustavus
151 km (94 miles) N of Kake
153 km (96 miles) SE of Haines

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.
