## ALASKA EARTHQUAKE INFORMATION CENTER

The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a minor earthquake that occurred on Tuesday, July 29th at 11:17 PM AKDT in the Prince William Sound region of Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 3.5 and was located at a depth of about 9 miles (15 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. No reports of this event being felt or causing damage have been received at this time.

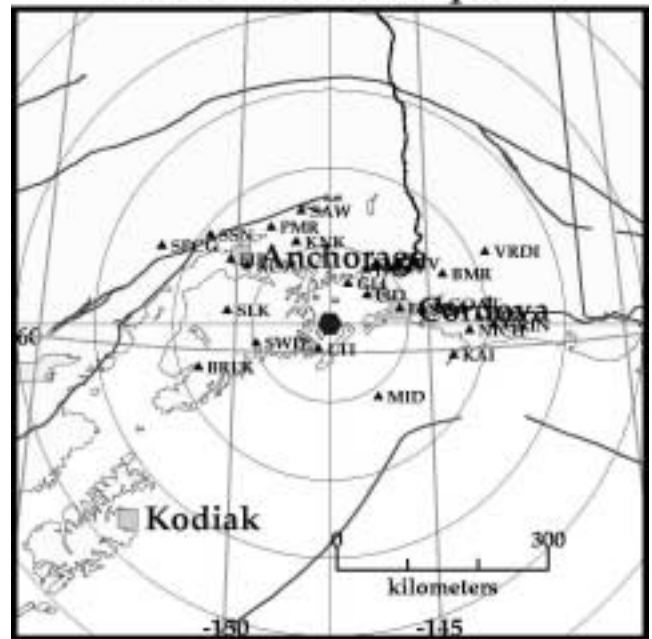
### Distance to nearby locations:

- 40 km ( 25 miles) NE of Chenega Bay
- 73 km ( 46 miles) SW of Tatitlek
- 76 km ( 48 miles) SE of Whittier
- 100 km ( 63 miles) E of Moose Pass
- 101 km ( 63 miles) W of Cordova
- 107 km ( 67 miles) SW of Valdez
- 108 km ( 67 miles) ENE of Seward
- 108 km ( 67 miles) SE of Girdwood

Circles are 111 km (70 miles) apart.

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.
