## ALASKA EARTHQUAKE INFORMATION CENTER

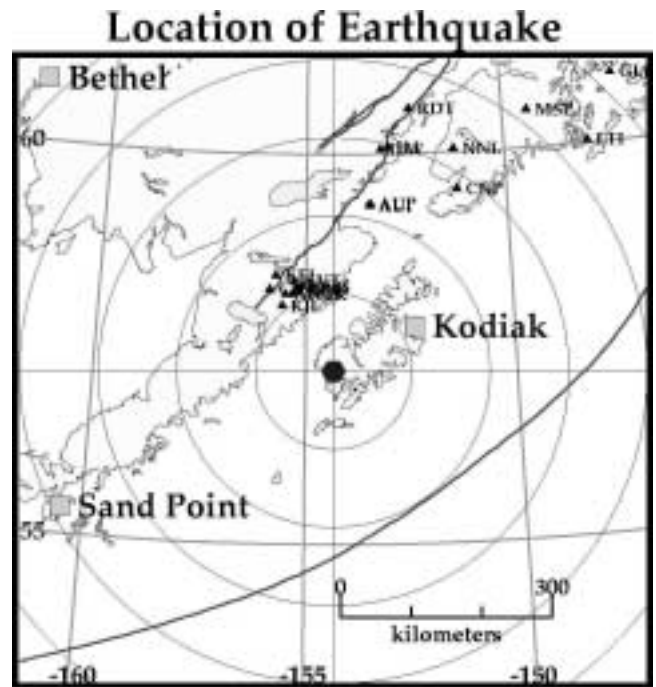
The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a minor earthquake that occurred on Monday, July 10th at 6:08 PM AKDT in the Kodiak Island region of Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 3.6 and was located at a depth of about 42 miles (67 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. The event was felt on Kodiak. No reports of damage have been received at this time.

### Distance to nearby locations:

- 32 km ( 20 miles) NNW of Akhiok
- 40 km ( 25 miles) S of Karluk
- 42 km ( 26 miles) SSW of Larsen Bay
- 62 km ( 39 miles) W of Old Harbor
- 113 km ( 71 miles) SW of Port Lions
- 132 km ( 82 miles) WSW of Kodiak
- 135 km ( 84 miles) SW of Ouzinkie
- 198 km ( 124 miles) E of Pilot Point

### Preliminary earthquake parameters:

 Latitude: 57 N 13'  
 Longitude: 154 W 20'  
 Depth: 67 km  
 Magnitude: ML 3.6



Circles are 111 km (70 miles) apart.

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.

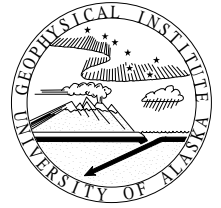
