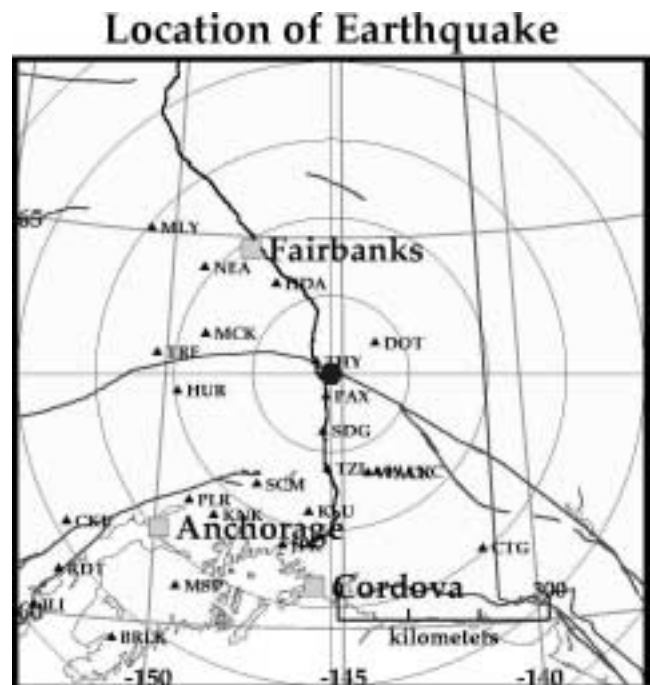
The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a light earthquake that occurred on Tuesday, November 26th at 7:06 AM AKST in the east-central region of Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 4.2 and was located at a depth of about 0 miles (0 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. This event was felt strongly at Paxson. No reports of damage have been received at this time.

#### Distance to nearby locations:

26 km ( 17 miles) NNE of Paxson  
28 km ( 18 miles) SE of Pump Station #10  
78 km ( 48 miles) SSE of Pump Station #9  
84 km ( 52 miles) SSE of Fort Greely  
89 km ( 55 miles) SSE of Delta Junction  
93 km ( 58 miles) NW of Slana  
107 km ( 67 miles) N of Gakona  
117 km ( 73 miles) W of Tok

Latitude: 63 N 16'  
Longitude: 145 W 20'  
Depth: 0 km  
Magnitude: ML 4.2



Circles are 111 km (70 miles) apart.

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.
