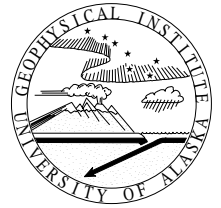

## ALASKA EARTHQUAKE INFORMATION CENTER

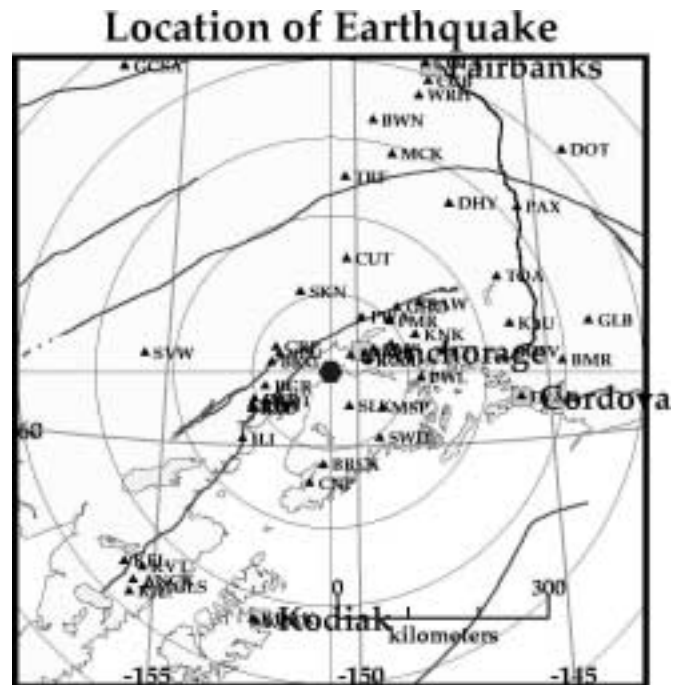
The Alaska Earthquake Information Center located a light earthquake that occurred on Saturday, November 15th at 12:33 PM AKST in the Kenai Peninsula region of Alaska. This earthquake had a preliminary magnitude of 4.0 and was located at a depth of about 36 miles (57 km). The magnitude and location may change slightly as additional data are received and processed. This event was felt in Anchorage, but no reports of this event causing damage have been received at this time.

### Distance to nearby locations:

- 26 km ( 16 miles) ESE of Tyonek
- 47 km ( 29 miles) N of Sterling
- 52 km ( 33 miles) WSW of Anchorage
- 54 km ( 34 miles) NNE of Kenai
- 56 km ( 35 miles) NNE of Soldotna
- 58 km ( 36 miles) W of Hope
- 59 km ( 37 miles) WSW of Elmendorf AFB
- 64 km ( 40 miles) WSW of Fort Richardson

### Preliminary earthquake parameters:

Origin Time (UT): 11/15/2003 21:33:54  
 Latitude: 60 N 57'  
 Longitude: 150 W 43'  
 Depth: 57 km  
 Magnitude: ML 4.0



Circles are 111 km (70 miles) apart.

The location and magnitude for this earthquake may be updated as data from additional seismic stations are received. The Alaska Earthquake Information Center will continue to gather data and may issue additional releases as appropriate. With any moderate or large earthquake, aftershocks should be expected to occur.

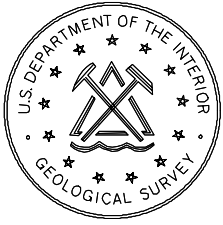

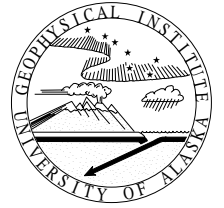
